



Cannabis is now legal in Canada. What does that mean for You?

Cannabis is regulated in Canada by a combination of federal, provincial and municipal rules. Here's an overview of what you should know about each level of government's regulations.

Summer Village of Ghost Lake

- Cannabis may be consumed on private property in any form (smoking, vaping, or edibles)
- Consumption of recreational cannabis is prohibited in any form (smoking, vaping, or edibles) in the Summer Village public places such as the playground, golf course, sport court, public beach, and at the Community Services Building.
- Smoking or vaping of any kind is prohibited on all trails.

Government of Alberta

- In Alberta, the legal age to purchase cannabis is 18+ years
- Youth can't enter cannabis stores, even with an adult
- Cannabis can be bought at licensed stores or online at albertacannabis.org
- 30 grams of dried cannabis or equivalent is the most you can buy or carry in public at a time
- Cannabis can't be consumed in vehicles, even by passengers

Government of Canada

- Driving while impaired by cannabis can result in criminal charges or even jail time. The RCMP enforces federal and provincial laws around impaired driving
- You can grow up to 4 plants per household (not 4 per person)
- Edibles are not yet legal to sell, but you can make your own at home
- Giving or selling cannabis to anyone under the age of 18 can result in criminal charges or jail time

Enforcement

- Similarly, to the laws regarding Alcohol consumption, the RCMP will be responsible for
 - underage use
 - public intoxication
 - driving while under the influence
- Under Provincial laws, a person is allowed to smoke, vape or otherwise consume cannabis on their private property.
- The Summer Village of Ghost Lake does not regulate use on private property.
- On private property, The Summer Village views cannabis smoke in the same way as tobacco smoke. It may be annoying to some, but it is legal.
- Cannabis can produce a strong smell that can be considered unpleasant. If you consume at home, consider smoking indoors or in areas that are not near neighbors' doors or windows. Please be courteous.
