


2023 IN REVIEW

Climate Resilience Capacity Building Program

Our Climate Reslience Capacity Building Program came to a close this fall. The project addresses groundwater resilience and provides a plan for the community and homeowners to ensure they have access to sufficient drinking water in the face of climate change.

Frozen Lake Safety Tips



As more and more ice covers the lake, it's crucial to make sure you know how to tell when conditions are safe for various activities. However, it's important to recognize that ice will never be completely safe.

Frozen Lake Safety Tips

- Avoid traveling on a frozen lake early or late in the season as the ice is more likely to be thin
- Always go out on the ice with a buddy and let others know where you will be in case of an accident.
- Leave a safe distance between you and your buddy while walking out onto the ice. This can help to avoid ice cracking under the weight of two people and allows for your buddy to help you if you fall through the ice.
- Wear a life vest while walking or riding on a frozen lake; it can help you float if you fall through the ice and provides insulation from the cold.

Carry useful tools with you such as homemade ice picks or a pair of wooden handled screwdrivers tied together with a few yards of strong cord that can be used to pull yourself up and onto the ice if you fall in.

Reminder: AED Kit

The village's AED (Automatic External Defibrillator) now has up-to-date Contact pads for adults. Our AED Kit is inside our Community Hall in the white wall cabinet next to the washroom/kitchen door.

The AED kit is registered with AHS' Heart-Safe Program. The cabinet also contains a First Aid kit, an Eyewash Station, a Lifeway-airway kit and a Naloxone Injection Kit.

Villagers should be familiar with their hall access code and the contents as well as the proper use of these kits.





Reminders

Fire and First Response in the Village

The Summer Village and the MD of Bighorn have a Fire Services agreement in place. This means when a 911 call is placed for Fire or Emergencies the Jamieson Fire Hall is our designated first responder.

Fire Insurance Please check your fire insurance policy to confirm that the Summer Village of Ghost Lake's nearest "manned" fire station is in the Town of Cochrane. Jamieson Fire Hall is the first responder for Village fires; however, they are classified as a volunteer fire department. It is important that your insurance company is aware of that. Also, under the provisions of the fire bylaw, property owners can be billed for the cost of fighting fires on their property. This can amount to thousands of dollars. Check with your insurance company to ensure that you have adequate coverage for firefighting expenses.

911 Medical Emergency calls will still result in an ambulance being dispatched from Cochrane. The Jamieson Fire Hall will also respond, as our medical first responders, to provide emergency medical support until an ambulance can arrive on scene.

If someone is available - pull the Emergency Pull Station on the Community Services Building. This will sound the Community Alarm so your neighbors will be alerted to the potential danger
